The psychology of cardiology has gained in its value and importance in clinical practice. Cardiac patients survive a host of adversities in today's practice. As patients live longer, they also have to cope with the stress and psychological effects of disease management longer. For example, implantable cardioverter defibrillators (ICDs), are lifesaving devices for patients with ventricular arrhythmia who are at risk for sudden cardiac arrest. ICDs are programmed to recognize a life-threatening arrhythmia and deliver a shock that corrects the arrhythmia before it can stop the heart.

Studies have shown that patients live with fear and anxiety that either the device may not work when needed, or resulting from the realization that by the very nature of the device, they have survived a life-threatening event. This educational program highlights state-of-the-art of research on psychological and emotional wellbeing in cardiac patients. In addition to Dr. Sears presentation, a local patient will present his/her experience in managing cardiac disease in a brief format. Emphasis will be cardiac electrophysiology but other areas of cardiac care will be covered as well.
