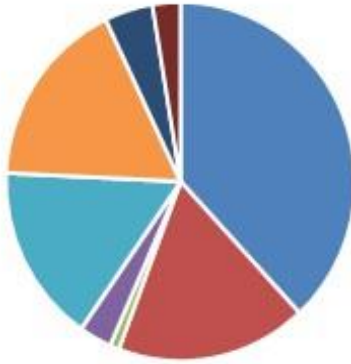

CVI typically hosts 100-300 attendees at each of our programs. Target audiences include adult and pediatric cardiologists including clinical, interventional, electrophysiology, heart failure, lipids, diabetes/metabolic syndrome as well as surgery subspecialists. We also host primary care, emergency medicine, geriatrics, and endocrinology physicians. CVI programs are well attended by cardiology and endocrinology fellows and residents at each of our programs.

CVI hosts advance practice providers, nurse practitioners, physician assistants as well as nurses. Imaging-focused programs provide required certification credits for cardiac sonographers and nuclear technologists. Purpose of Form
